GENERAL REGULATIONS

ELIGIBILITY:

The 2017 Skate Canada-Eastern Ontario STARSkate Championships will be conducted in accordance with the regulations as set forth in the Skate Canada Rule book. If not specifically stated otherwise in this document, the normal regulations governing skating will apply as indicated in the Skate Canada Rulebook (the Technical and Event Management Handbooks, the Policies and Procedures Manual and CPC Regulations).

AGE AND TEST QUALIFICATIONS:

- ▶ Age Qualification shall apply as of July 1, 2016
- ▶ Test Qualification **unless otherwise stated** shall apply as of November 15, 2016

DRAWS – STARTING ORDERS:

The skating order shall be determined by random draw in each event. The starting order for the first segment of the event will be available prior to the start of the competition on the Section Website at www.skate-eos.on.ca

RESULTS:

The Cumulative Points System (CPC) will be used for STAR 5 & up.

REGISTRATION:

Registration may be limited if entries exceed the amount of ice time available.

▶ ONLINE REGISTRATION:

- All Registrations must be completed online by **Friday, January 6, 2017 at 11:59 pm**. It is important to note that once the deadline date and time has been reached **online registration payment** will not be available.
 - NO ENTRIES will be accepted after **Friday, January 6, 2017 at 11:59 pm**.
- \$25.00 fee for all incomplete entries – upon notification by Section, payment to be made by contacting our office with either Visa or MasterCard information.
- **NOTE: Once the deadline date and time has been closed requests to change STAR categories will not be accepted.**

Single Entries: A single entry in a qualifying category at EOSIC is expected to perform an exhibition skate and pay half of the entry fee.

The EO Competition Event Committee (CEC) Liaison and the EO Officials Chair reserve the right to limit the number of entries in any event as well as to combine or subdivide events as numbers may warrant.

PLANNED PROGRAM:

Planned Program Sheets can be accessed on the Competition [Event] web page at the Skate Canada-Eastern Ontario website www.skate-eos.on.ca – you are required to print your Planned Program sheet and submit at on-site registration. One Program per page. Planned Program sheets are required for Creative Skills.

RESULTS CALCULATION:

Please note that the CPC judging system will be used for all events from STAR 5 up.

REFUNDS OF ENTRY FEES FOR SECTION PARTNERED EVENTS:

When skaters are advised prior to departing for a Section partnered competition that the event that they have registered in has been cancelled, the skaters may be given the option of either skating an exhibition (time permitting) and use of a practice session at the discretion of the Tech Rep for half the entry fee or withdraw from the event and receive a full refund.

If the skaters choose to skate an exhibition and, due to unforeseen circumstances, after arriving at the competition are denied the opportunity to do so, they shall receive a full refund.

When, due to unforeseen circumstances, skaters are advised at a competition that their event has been cancelled, they may be offered the opportunity to skate an exhibition (time permitting) and use of a practice session at the discretion of the Tech Rep and receive a full refund.

If an entry is withdrawn before the closing date of entry, a refund of the full entry fee less a \$25.00 administration fee will be given. The administration fee for all refunds will be set at \$25.00 per event (singles, dance or pairs) to a maximum of \$50.00 per person, dance, or pair team.

No refunds will be given after the closing date of entry.



ACCREDITATION FOR EVENTS – COACHES:

In order to receive accreditation at the competition, all coaches must meet the standards for coaches set out in Rule 2402 and 2408 as outlined below.

Coaches Must:

- Be NCCP Coach – Primary STARSkate Certified minimum
- Be a current coaching member of Skate Canada
- Hold a valid First Aid Certificate
- Register in person and provide photo ID
- Wear event accreditation provided

New Coaches or foreign coaches, who do not meet the above criteria, will be accredited only if they qualify in accordance with Skate Canada Policies and Procedures.

USE OF AN INDIVIDUALS LIKENESS OR PERFORMANCE:

Any person who enters competitions, either sanctioned by the Association or under the control and/or supervision of the Association, or who takes Association tests, by entering such competitions or by taking such tests, grants to the Association the right to use, in such form and for such time period as the Association may, in its sole discretion choose, without payment of any fee or charge, any photographs, images, likenesses, videotapes or any other recordings or reproductions of the person or his/her performance for the purpose of furthering the objectives of the Association, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing:

- For the training, education and development of skaters, coaches and officials; and
- For Association promotional purposes.

MUSIC:

- All Music used must be in the public domain or covered by the Performing Rights Society.
- Skaters that have music composed especially for their programs, either in wholly or in part shall be responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and television, or appropriate clearance from the Performing Rights Society.
- Music must be registered at Music Registration at least one hour before the event.

DANCE MUSIC:

Ice dancers are able to use the following music for all pattern dance events: 2001 Skate Canada Series 8, ISU music, or a selection from the Skate Canada approved list of contemporary music. Note: If an ice dance competitor is choosing to use ISU music or a contemporary piece of music they must supply the music to the competition as indicated in the competition announcement. Skate Canada Series 8 music will be used during the ice dance warm-up period. Skate Canada Series 8 will be used during the ice dance warm-up period.

TECHNICAL ADVISEMENT FROM THE EO MUSIC & ANNOUNCING COMMITTEE

- For optimum playback of the music recorded on CDs it is recommended that the music be recorded (written) to the CD in either Compact Disc Audio (CDA) or Wave file (wav) format. Music recorded in MP3 or I-Tune format may not play from the EO music playback equipment.
- **Standard Specifications for CDs:** Each entry must provide 2 CDs for the competition upon registration.
- One for Competition (Marked 'Master') and one for back up (marked 'copy').
- Only one (1) program shall be recorded on each CD
- The start of the music shall be recorded on the CD with less than 2 seconds of lead in



- Team's name followed by music time (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on side one of the CD
- Each CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container and marked as noted below:
 - Skater's name, Club, Event
 - Actual music playing time (not skating time nor the event time)
- For optimum playback of the music recorded on CDs it is recommended that the music be recorded (written) to the CD in either Compact Disc Audio (CDA) or Wave file (wav) format. Music recorded in MP3 or I-Tune format may not play from the EO music playback equipment.

AWARDS:

Awards will be presented as per Regulation 7000-E-1.5 of the Skate Canada Event Management Handbook and the Skate Canada-Eastern Ontario Policy Book Section 5. Skaters must be in skating attire and skates for all presentations.

TONI CARR BURSARY:

Toni Carr was a member of the Skate Canada-Eastern Ontario Board of Directors for twenty years (1987-2007) and for four years was the Section Chair (1997-2001). In addition, Toni was a Skate Canada Judge (Singles & Dance) as well as an Evaluator (Freeskate, Dance & Skating Skills). In her role as an administrator/volunteer and as a judge/evaluator, Toni's primary interest was the development of young skaters in the Eastern Ontario Section and she contributed much of her time, energy and skills to ensure skaters would have opportunities that would help them develop to their maximum potential.

In Toni's memory and in recognition of her special interest in the Section's test skaters, the Board of Directors of Skate Canada-Eastern Ontario has established four (4) bursaries for skaters who compete at the Eastern Ontario STARSkate Invitational Championship (EOSIC). A bursary in the amount of \$250.00 will be awarded to the first- place finish in each of four (4) categories – Pre-Juvenile Men U11, Pre-Juvenile Women U11, Senior Bronze Men and Senior Bronze Women - provided there is a minimum of three (3) skaters who compete in the respective categories. The Bursaries will be forwarded to the recipients after the close of the competition.

COSTUMING:

The clothing for all competitors must be modest, dignified and appropriate for athletic competition – not garish or theatrical in design. Accessories and props are not permitted.

EVENT SCHEDULE:

A finalized schedule of events, Skater List, and, Starting Order (first event only) will be provided at registration on-site and will be posted on the **2017 EOSIC** webpage prior to the competition. Events may proceed up to one- half hour prior to the published schedule.

ACCIDENTS/LIABILITY:

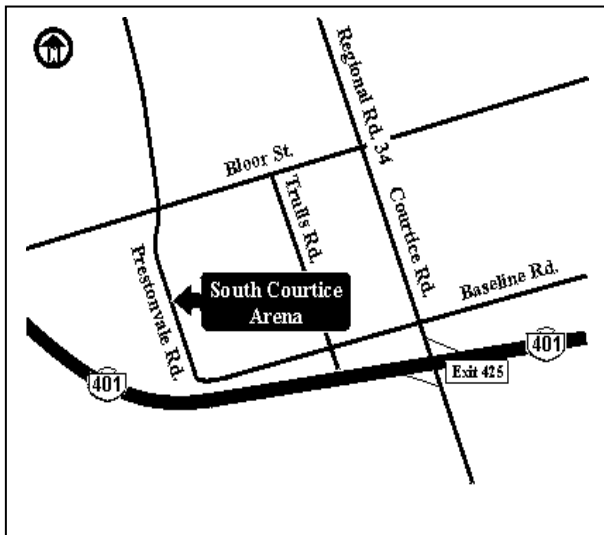
Skate Canada, the Section and the Host Committee accept no liability for bodily or personal injury, or for property loss or damage incurred by participants and officials. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in the competition, all participants and their parents or guardians, shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with, the conduct and management of the competition and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, Skate Canada, the Section and the Volunteer Team and their officers and their entries shall be accepted on these conditions.

CONCUSSION IN SPORT:

There has been an increasing recognition of severity of concussions in sport. Skate Canada and its medical team recognize this importance and the need for athletes, parents, coaches, officials and other team members to rapidly and appropriately recognize and respond to a concussion injury. We further recognize the need for our rules and procedures to support the appropriate response to a concussion injury.

For that reason, a decision has been made for all Skate Canada qualifying and non-qualifying competitions, effective immediately, that in the case of a **head injury or possible concussion during a program that is then stopped by the event medical personnel and/or the referee** the 5-point penalty for program stoppage will not be applied.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

1. Be eligible person(s) as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book Section 5000 A 2.0. 2.
2. Be Registrant(s) in good standing of the Association.
3. Please note the following restrictions:

COMPETITIVE SKATERS:

- Skaters registered to compete in any event at the Novice or higher level at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition, do not qualify to compete in the Skate Ontario Championships in any STARSkate category. They may enter the Skate Ontario Championships Pre-Juvenile or Juvenile categories in a different discipline. For example, a competitor in Novice Men at Sectionals may still compete in Juvenile Pairs at the Skate Ontario Championships.



- Skaters registered to compete in any event at the Pre-Novice level at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition are eligible to compete at the Skate Ontario Championships in STARSkate, Pre-Juvenile or Juvenile categories in a different discipline. For example, a competitor in Pre Novice Dance at Sectionals may compete in Gold Ladies Free Skate at the Skate Ontario Championships.
- There are no restrictions for skaters entered in Pre Juvenile and Juvenile events at any time during the season.
- Athletes at the Skate Ontario Championships have the freedom to move from PreJuvenile and/or Juvenile to STAR categories at any point during the season. Likewise, skaters entering STAR categories have the same opportunity to try Pre-Juvenile and/or Juvenile categories at any point during the season.
- Skaters at any level of competition will need to meet the age and test requirements indicated for the category in which they intend to compete.

*For purposes of interpretation of this regulation, registration for a Sectional or qualifying event is defined as the submission of a registration form for such event.

The section may hold Pre Juvenile and Juvenile Sectional Championship events and the Skate Ontario Championship qualifying events at the time of the section STARSkate championships in February. Skaters may enter these categories as long as they have not competed at the Pre Novice level or higher in the same

4. **WINNER OF A PREVIOUS SKATE ONTARIO EVENT:** A previous winner of a Skate Ontario Championship category is not eligible to re-enter the same category.
5. **TEST AND AGE PREREQUISITES:** All competitors wishing to enter the 2017 Skate Ontario Championships and events leading to it shall meet the test requirements to compete before November 15, 2016 preceding the competition. Age requirements shall be met before July 1, 2016 preceding the competition.
6. Skaters may participate in either the 2017 Skate Ontario Championships or the 2017 Skate Ontario Adult Invitational, but not both.
7. Skaters may qualify for only ONE of STAR 5, 6, 8, 10 or Gold Singles category OR a Pre-Juvenile or Juvenile Singles category, but not more than one.
8. Skaters may qualify for only ONE of STAR 7 or STAR 9. Skaters may qualify for STAR 7 or STAR 9 in addition to their Free Skate (STAR, Pre-Juvenile, or Juvenile) or other category.
9. Where there are multiple age levels for an event category a skater may qualify for one age level only.



10. Triathlon skaters are eligible for Free Skate and Short Program categories. Entrants must register to compete in the highest Triathlon level that their test qualifications qualify them for.

11. Skaters may skate up one level in the Free Skate categories at their respective Section qualifier if desired, however at the Skate Ontario Championships skaters must compete in the category that they qualified for at their Section qualifier. Skating up is not permitted in the Triathlon, Pair or Dance events.
